In a year in which Hong Kong continued to face the complexities of COVID-19 restrictions and its consequences, we are immensely proud of everything that our staff and volunteer teams at Sons & Daughters have achieved for, and with, our beneficiaries in 2022.

Together, we navigated and co-created ways to continue to champion those who have been caught up in the trappings of commercial sexual exploitation to reclaim love, family and freedom in their lives.

Most notable of 2022's highlights is the opening of our new drop-in centre, Promise House 3.0. We saw the story of the five loaves and two fish come to life before our eyes as we brought forth the humble amount that we had, and watched the miraculous multiplication of resources. In just a few short weeks, the New Promise House campaign raised over \$600,000 and enabled us to move into, and renovate, a premises twice the size of our previous space. With the beautiful new expansion, we were able to deliver more than double the number of skills training classes in our dedicated workshop and classroom areas, and continue to welcome many more beneficiaries to access support, community and belonging.

In line with the expansion of our space, more new additions to the S&D family sprouted - the lovely faces of children and babies began to appear in Promise House as mothers became regulars at our drop-in classes. Over time, the needs and challenges that these precious ones experience came into focus - which led to the conception of our children's project. In 2022, we started to deliver academic tutoring to the children of the women, as well as psychosocial support through play therapy and tangible items such as food, school supplies and clothing. We look forward to growing in our work with the children in the coming year.

After several years of prayer and preparation, our men's project, Dawn, was officially launched, aimed at providing support to those who no longer wish to purchase sex. With training and consultation with organisations that are established in this area of work, the men's team has developed our own Dawn training course for volunteers and put together the programme framework, to be piloted in 2023.


The end of 2022 was accented by the joyous celebration of Princess and Angel's graduation from our Aftercare programme.

Wan Chai

Wanchai has been quite a ride this year, but still fruitful in its own beautiful way. While the scenery has changed drastically since 4-5 years ago, we are seeing our purpose in the streets of Lockhart Road grow even more. We continue to praise God that strip clubs remain shut! We thank God for stronger relationships with bouncers and connections with co-owners of bars. These are the gatekeepers to being able to get in to talk to women. We continue to see the power of prayer in all that we do and see how it encourages the hearts of the women and men we meet. While Wan Chai remains a little unpredictable at times, we will continue to be faithful where He has placed us. The heavens rejoice even if just one soul gets touched!

OUTREACH

Causeway Bay

With COVID-19 restrictions easing up towards the end of this year, the Causeway Bay team has seen an influx of overseas women filling up the brothel rooms again. Most women from overseas were brought to Hong Kong via a manager on a tourist visa, staying in Hong Kong for a month at a time. We have met women from across the Asia Pacific region, as well Eastern Europe. Relationships have been deepened with two older ladies in particular, where the team was able to dine with them outside of their workplaces. We continue to pray for the women who are not in Hong Kong for an extended period of time, that with the 1-2 interactions with us, they are still able to feel God's love and care for them, and know that they are valued and remembered.







Temple Street

Perseverance and provision are the two key words for the Temple Street Outreach team. Despite the challenges of in-person outreach at the beginning of the year, our team managed to adjust ourselves after a brief break and reach out to the women through messages and calls during a strong COVID-19 wave. Covid relief items such as medicine, test kits and groceries were delivered to the women, while a couple of them also received emergency support including food and clothes. One woman also received a donated laptop from us before her trip back home.

Each outreach night was made possible when we persevere through ups and downs of work and life. Despite the change and adjustment of some team members, we also celebrated the birth of a baby! Now, towards the end of the year, God is showing us something new. We started to partner with Eden Ministry in our street outreach, and a new door was opened where we were shown the needs of women in the brothel buildings. We are excited to see more great things of God in the coming year!




DROP-IN

NEW Promise House!

At the start of the year, we were bursting at the seams with people and activity as more classes, skills training, counseling and casework sessions were being delivered to meet the corresponding increase in demand. We were grateful to our church partners who graciously lent us space to accommodate the overflow, and we also recognised that it was time to expand!

Encouraged by the story of how Jesus multiplied 5 loaves and 2 fish to feed thousands, we shared our need with the public and were amazed by the



generosity of our supporters who rapidly responded to raise the funds needed in just 2 short months. In April, we renovated and moved into Promise House 3.0, which is a space that is bigger and better than we dreamed for!

This new home now has more than doubled our capacity and now hosts a dedicated classroom, two counselling rooms, a living room, pantry and a whole separate workshop for skills training. It has been a joy to see the place bustling with life, laughter and connection. We hope to see you there soon!

Laptops and wifi eggs

In partnership with Crossroads Foundation, we were able to equip 14 women who were attending our computer class with refurbished laptops and wifi eggs this year. These laptops not only enabled them to have proper practice in class and at home, but also helped the women to engage longer and better in the learning process and develop more confidence in the talents God has given them.

DROP IN - INVEST

Food & Health Supplies & Vouchers

Over the course of the year, we distributed 5456 food items & 2761 health supplies through our drop-in services. We also continued to assist beneficiaries and their children to have 3 healthy meals a day through dispersing \$38750 supermarket & \$9750 food vouchers. These vouchers helped the women with more choices in their daily life.




We nurtured relationships with 29 regular attendees at Promise House through lunches, conversations and fun activities. 49 sessions of fun classes such as baking, Mandarin learning and fitness classes were held to connect with the women. We celebrated 4 festivals with the women - we passed them Chinese blessing bags on Chinese New Year; folded origami bunnies and prayed together on Easter; crafted colorful lanterns in Mid-Autumn and celebrated the joy of Christ at our annual Christmas party! Despite the challenges of Covid restrictions on social gatherings, these special occasions were filled with joy, creativity and love as we connected with those women who rarely have a proper chance to celebrate the holidays. Being an extension to Sons & Daughters' outreach programme, our drop-in service has provided 24 crisis intervention sessions, home visits to 7 women, and gave out different emergency items such as clothing, toiletries, baby items, blankets and food vouchers.

2022 also brought several little lovelies through our doors as women came with their children. As we learned more about the struggles that the mothers and children face, we turned our listening into action, and from our wonderful team of volunteers, provided 14 sessions of play therapy, over 112 hours of academic tutoring, and 2 months of temporary safe accommodation to a child. We have identified this as a new and emerging area of service, and will be developing a pilot children's programme in 2023.






DROP IN - CULTIVATE



Cultivate

A total of 71 sessions of spiritual development classes were organized this year to help the women discover and leverage their spiritual gifts. Classes such as Alpha Course, Friendship Class and New Testament studies created opportunities for us to guide the women in understanding the scriptures and applying them in their daily lives.

This was the second year of running our 12-week candle-making programme for In addition, we provided 26 sessions of computer literacy classes, which covered drop-in beneficiaries, and we completed 3 rounds! 


Along with our expanded facility came new room for growth and space for integral parts of our programme to flourish. The addition of two private meeting rooms enabled counselling and casework sessions to take place in safe and confidential environments, as the Trainees navigated healing and future-focused planning. Our brand new classroom space hosted a plethora of skill-building sessions ranging from video-editing to public speaking, through which the Trainees explored new skills and grew in their confidence.





In 2022 we also welcomed a new staff member aboard the Aftercare team. This year, the need for intentional support for the children of our beneficiaries was Charlotte, a Psychology graduate who was working at Sons & Daughters as an illuminated. As she steps into this new chapter of her life, we are confident that Princess will use the head, hand, and heart skills she has uncovered and developed to bring about joy to all she comes in contact with.

She especially shone in presentation class, sewing artistry, and teaching East African cooking classes. When faced with challenges, Angel turned first to the Lord as her provider. As she grew in her own confidence, she found joy and purpose in inspiring others to try new things and take steps toward pursuing their own freedom and restoration. We are excited to see the extent of where her greenhouse business will take her, but more importantly to witness the testimony of the transformative love of God as Angel goes on to be a light in her family and community.



Reclaim Freedom


We empower men and women caught in exploitation to reclaim a life of autonomy.

We provide a holistic care program and skills training for all our beneficiaries to recover their talents and abilities.

This year, we revamped our signature scented candles after the success of last Christmas' campaign. After four years, we decided to retire the Exodus Collection, which consisted of the classic scents (Apple Cinnamon, Lavender, Rose, Sandalwood, and Vanilla) that made people first fall in love with ReStore candles. With the help of our artisans, we developed a new signature collection with a variety of delicious scents (Cashmere Vanilla, Citrus Punch, Cotton Field Leather & Juniper, Salt & Sea, and White Tea) and updated the label to match our black and gold box for an elegant, sleek look. 




RESTORE


